WHAT IS NUBEQA®?

NUBEQA® (darolutamide) is a prescription medicine used to treat adults with prostate cancer:

- that has not spread to other parts of the body and no longer responds to medical or surgical treatment that lowers testosterone (non-metastatic castration-resistant prostate cancer or nmCRPC), or
- that has spread to other parts of the body and responds to medical or surgical treatment that lowers testosterone (metastatic hormone-sensitive prostate cancer or mHSPC), in combination with docetaxel

It is not known if NUBEQA is safe and effective in women or children.

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




Knowing your diagnosis can help you discuss treatment options

Prostate cancer takes place in the prostate, a small gland located below the bladder. It happens when the body cannot control the growth of abnormal prostate cells. Prostate cancer may become metastatic, which means it has spread to other parts of the body, such as the bones, lungs, liver, or lymph nodes.

Your doctor will tell you which type of prostate cancer you have. NUBEQA®* is approved to treat two types of prostate cancer:

ABOUT NUBEQA®

What Is NUBEQA?

NUBEQA is a type of oral medicine called an **androgen receptor inhibitor**, or an **ARI**. It is not chemotherapy.

How NUBEQA Works

Prostate cancer cells contain molecules called **androgen receptors** (ARs). When testosterone attaches to an AR, it causes cancer cells to grow. NUBEQA attaches to the AR and blocks testosterone from attaching to help delay cancer cells from growing.



ABOUT NUBEQA®

If you have **metastatic hormone-sensitive prostate cancer**, your doctor may consider using a combination of treatments to treat your prostate cancer. The NUBEQA combination* is an option they can consider.



If you have **non-metastatic castration-resistant prostate cancer**, a combination of treatments is one option your doctor can consider using. Your doctor may consider NUBEQA + hormone therapy[†] to treat your prostate cancer.

32% lower risk of death with NUBEQA

The NUBEQA combination* extended overall survival by lowering the risk of death by 32% (compared with men who only received hormone therapy[†] + chemotherapy).

Another way to look at results:

In the study for mHSPC, more men treated with the NUBEQA combination* were alive at 4 years

- 63% of men were still alive with the NUBEQA combination*
- 50% of men were still alive with hormone therapy[†] + chemotherapy alone

Proven results in metastatic hormone-sensitive prostate cancer (mHSPC) How NUBEQA was studied in mHSPC



A clinical study of 1305 men with mHSPC compared the NUBEQA combination[†] with hormone therapy* + docetaxel (chemotherapy).

In the same study, the NUBEQA combination[†] delayed pain getting worse



It took significantly longer for pain to get worse in men with mHSPC who were treated with the NUBEQA combination[†] compared with men who only received hormone therapy* + chemotherapy. Overall, the NUBEQA combination[†] reduced the risk of pain getting worse by 21%.




PROVEN RESULTS WITH NUBEQA® IN nmCRPC

Proven results in non-metastatic castration-resistant prostate cancer (nmCRPC) In a clinical study, men treated with NUBEQA lived longer without their cancer spreading



Men with nmCRPC who were treated with NUBEQA and hormone therapy* lived more than twice as long without their cancer spreading to other parts of the body, compared with men who only received hormone therapy (median[†] 3.4 years vs 1.5 years).

Proven results in non-metastatic castration-resistant prostate cancer (nmCRPC)

In the same study, NUBEQA also helped men live longer

31% lower risk of death with NUBEQA

Men with nmCRPC who were treated with NUBEQA + hormone therapy* had a 31% lower risk of dying than men on hormone therapy alone.

Another way to look at results:

In the study for nmCRPC, more men treated with NUBEQA + hormone therapy* were alive at 3 years

- 83% of men who are still alive with NUBEQA + hormone therapy*
- 77% of men were still alive with hormone therapy* alone



2 TABLETS TWICE A DAY WITH FOOD



TAKING NUBEQA

- Take your prescribed dose of NUBEQA 2 times a day with food
- Swallow NUBEQA tablets whole
- Your healthcare provider may change your dose, temporarily stop, or completely stop your treatment with NUBEQA if you have certain side effects
- If you miss a dose of NUBEQA, take your normal dose as soon as possible prior to the next scheduled dose. Return to your normal schedule on the following day. Do not take 2 doses together to make up for a missed dose
- If you take more NUBEQA than prescribed, call your healthcare provider right away
- You should continue hormone therapy during your treatment with NUBEQA unless you had surgery to lower the amount of testosterone in your body (surgical castration)
- Take NUBEQA exactly as your healthcare provider tells you



- Your doctor should start your treatment with docetaxel within the first 6 weeks of starting NUBEQA
- Docetaxel is given once every 3 weeks (21 days) as an intravenous (IV) infusion in your arm for a . total of up to 6 treatment cycles (approximately 5 months)
- Your doctor may change, delay, or stop treatment with docetaxel if needed
- Treatment with NUBEQA can continue after completing chemotherapy as prescribed by your doctor

- If you miss a dose of NUBEQA, take your normal dose as soon as possible before your next scheduled dose. Do not take 2 doses together to make up for a missed dose
- If you take more NUBEQA than prescribed, call your healthcare provider right away

- Decreased white blood cells
- Increase in liver function tests
- Low blood calcium levels

The NUBEQA clinical study in patients with **nmCRPC*** was designed to measure metastasis-free survival (MFS) and also overall survival (OS). Men with nmCRPC who took NUBEQA + hormone therapy[†] lived more than twice as long without prostate cancer spreading to other parts of their body compared with men on hormone therapy alone (median[‡] 3.4 years vs 1.5 years). NUBEQA extended OS by lowering the risk of death by 31% compared with hormone therapy[†] alone.

The clinical study for NUBEQA in **mHSPC**[§] was designed to measure OS. NUBEQA extended OS by lowering the risk of death by 32% compared with docetaxel + hormone therapy[†] alone.

WHAT IS NUBEQA®?

NUBEQA® (darolutamide) is a prescription medicine used to treat adults with prostate cancer:

- that has not spread to other parts of the body and no longer responds to medical or surgical treatment that lowers testosterone (non-metastatic castration-resistant prostate cancer or nmCRPC), or
- that has spread to other parts of the body and responds to medical or surgical treatment that lowers testosterone (metastatic hormone-sensitive prostate cancer or mHSPC), in combination with docetaxel

It is not known if NUBEQA is safe and effective in women or children.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

Before taking NUBEQA, tell your healthcare provider about all your medical conditions, including if you:

- have heart problems, high blood pressure, diabetes, or high amounts of fat or cholesterol in your blood (dyslipidemia)
- have a history of seizures, brain injury, stroke, or brain tumors
- have kidney or liver problems



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
